O P I N I O N

By this application, Jen-Rem, Incorporated, doing business as Luxury Tours, seeks a Class B certificate to operate as a charter-party carrier of passengers within a radius of 40 air miles from its home terminal at 1810 West Foothill Boulevard, Upland, California, 91786.

Applicant is the owner of one 47- and one 43-passenger bus and is purchasing one 15-passenger bus. Applicant shows a net worth of approximately \$46,500 as of July 1, 1981.

Notice of the filing of the application appeared in the Commission's Daily Calendar of August 10, 1981, and copies of the application were served upon 62 Class "A" and "B" Charter-party carriers in the area.

No protests have been received.

Findings of Fact

1. Applicant has the fitness, equipment, and financial resources to perform the proposed service.
2. Public convenience and necessity require the service proposed by applicant.
3. Applicant should be authorized to pick up passengers within a radius of 40 air miles from its home terminal at 1810 West Foothill Boulevard, Upland, California, 91786.

4. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

5. A public hearing is not required.

Conclusion of Law

Public convenience and necessity have been demonstrated and a certificate should be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity, to be renewed each year, is granted to Jen-Rem, Incorporated authorizing it to operate as a Class B charter-party carrier of passengers, as defined in Public Utilities Code § 5383, from a service area within a radius of 40 air miles from its home terminal at 1810 West Foothill Boulevard, Upland, California, 91786.

2. The Passenger Operations Branch will issue the annual renewable certificate on Form PE-695 as authorized by Resolution PE-303, when it receives California Highway Patrol clearances and evidence of liability protection in compliance with General Order Series 115.

3. In providing service under the certificate, applicant shall comply with General Orders Series 98 and 115, and the California Highway Patrol safety rules.


This order becomes effective 30 days from today.
