ORDER EXTENDING SUSPENSION

California-American Water Company (Cal-Am), on April 23, 1981, under Advice Letter 223, filed tariff sheets for extending service to an area not previously served and contiguous to its Village District service area. The Commission's order in Case 10993 filed June 2, 1981 suspended these tariffs until September 20, 1981. By Decision 93538 we extended the suspension to March 20, 1982.

Cal-Am and protestant, City of Thousand Oaks, stipulate by letter filed December 7, 1981, that the hearing scheduled for January 4 and 5, 1982 be continued. The hearing has been rescheduled. Further Cal-Am, by the same letter, waives the limitation on the period for suspension and agrees to a new suspension date. It is necessary to extend the suspension of these tariffs; therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that the operation of each of the tariff sheets set forth in Advice Letter 223 of California-American Water Company (Cal-Am) is suspended for a further period, to June 30, 1982.

The Executive Director of the Commission is directed to send a copy of this order to Cal-Am by certified mail and to send a copy to the City of Thousand Oaks.
