ORDER CORRECTING CLERICAL ERROR

By Application (A.) 60984, Devine & Son Trucking Co. (Devine) seeks authority to exclude the transportation of fresh fruits and vegetables from its highway common carrier certificate issued under Public Utilities Code Section 1063.

By its Petition for Modification of Decision (D.) 92728 in A.59895, Devine requested simplification of the restrictions in its certificate. D.93502 authorized that modification. However, an exclusion of fresh fruits and vegetables in the revoked certificate was inadvertently omitted from the in-lieu certificate.

The necessary correction should be made by this order and Appendix A of D.93502 should be amended accordingly.

IT IS ORDERED that D.93502 is amended by substituting the attached First Revised Page 13 of Appendix A for Original Page 13.

This order is issued under Resolution A-4661.

Appendix A DEVINE & SON TRUCKING CO. First Revised Page 13 (D.93502) (a California corportation) Cancels Original Page 13

Shipments (1) between Sacramento, on the one hand, and the adjacent plant of the Campbell Soup Company, on the other hand; (2) between the city and plant, on the one hand, and State of California, Department of General Services Central Stores Warehouse, on the other hand; (3) between the city and plant, on the one hand, and Sacramento Air Logistics Center, McClellan Air Force Base, on the other hand; and (4) between any of the plants or other locations identified in (1), (2) and (3).

- 10. Collapsible containers transported on open top trucks, trailers, or semitrailers or any combination of such vehicles.
- 11. Shipments having either origin or destination at Camino.
- *12. Fresh fruits, nuts, vegetables, logs, and unprocessed agricultural commodities.
- D. Devine & Son Trucking is authorized to transport lumber and forest products (except sawdust as that commodity is described in Item 113200, National Motor Freight Classification 100-B, effective April 1, 1975).

Between all points and places on the following described highways:

- (1) U.S. Highway 101 between the California-Oregon State Line and Santa Barbara, inclusive.
- (2) Interstate Highway 5 between the California-Oregon State Line and its junction with State Highway 143 at Woodland: via State Highway 113 to its junction with Interstate Highway 80 at Davis; via Interstate Highway 80 to Sacramento, inclusive.
