O P I N I O N

Doris J. Peak, doing business as Blue Goose Charter Leasing, has applied for a Class B charter-party carrier of passengers certificate to operate from a home terminal in Anaheim. Copies of the application have been served on other carriers operating in the vicinity.

Applicant has never held operating authority from this Commission. However, she has several years' experience as driver and has managed other bus operations. She estimates that in a typical year she will operate 72,000 bus miles and receive \$120,000 of gross revenue. Costs for this operation are expected to be \$57,451. Applicant has \$78,140 in assets, \$50,000 of which is attributed to her two buses.

In addition to the notice mentioned above, notice of filing was contained in the Commission's Daily Calendar of January 25, 1982. No protests have been received.

Findings of Fact

1. Applicant possesses satisfactory fitness and financial responsibility to conduct the proposed transportation services.
2. Public convenience and necessity require the service proposed by applicant.

3. Applicant should be authorized to pick up passengers within a radius of 40 air miles from her home terminal at 1004 East Orange Fair Lane, Anaheim.

4. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

Conclusion of Law

Public convenience and necessity have been demonstrated and a certificate should be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity, to be renewed each year, is granted to applicant Doris J. Peak authorizing her to operate as a Class B charter-party carrier of passengers, as defined in PU Code § 5383, from a service area with a radius of 40 air miles from applicant's home terminal at 1004 East Orange Fair Lane, Anaheim.

2. The Passenger Operations Branch will issue the annual renewable certificate on Form PE-695 as authorized by Resolution PE-303 when it receives California Highway Patrol clearances and evidence of liability protection in compliance with General Order Series 11.


3. In providing service under the certificate, applicant shall comply with General Orders Series 98 and 115, and the California Highway Patrol safety rules.

This order becomes effective 30 days from today.
