Lee Roy White, Sr. and Helen Adeline White, partners doing business as L.R. White Trucking, request a dump truck carrier permit to operate in the Counties of Los Angeles, Orange, San Diego, Imperial, and Riverside.

Copies of the application were served on California Carriers Association, California Dump Truck Owners' Association, California Trucking Association, Highway Carriers Association, Associated Independent Owner-Operators, Inc., Southern California Rock Products Association, Aggregates & Concrete Association of Northern California, Inc., and California Asphalt Pavement Association. Notice of filing appeared on the Commission's Daily Calendar of March 29, 1982. No protests have been received.

Mr. White states he has worked in the trucking industry for 25 years and has operated most types of equipment. Applicants currently hold a heavy-specialized carrier permit under File T-137,472. They presently operate one tractor. Applicants' balance sheet of March 17, 1982 shows total assets of \$156,887 and a net worth of \$84,887.

A certificate of support for the application was submitted by Mark McDowell, president of the Mark McDowell Corporation, located in San Diego. This shipper states that it will engage applicants in the proposed counties 40 hours a week during the first year of operations.

Findings of Fact

- 1. Applicants:
 - a. Are fit and proper persons to receive a permit to operate as a dump truck carrier.
 - b. Have sufficient operating knowledge and financial ability to initiate and continue the proposed operation.
 - c. Have demonstrated that the privilege sought:
 - (1) Will not endanger the safety of the public or interfere with the public use of the public highways or impair the condition or maintenance of them, directly or indirectly.
 - (2) Will not unnecessarily burden the public highways.
 - (3) Is necessary to serve the public and will not impair the ability of presently permitted dump truck carriers to provide adequate service at the lowest possible reasonable rate.

2. Applicants have resided in the State of California for not less than 90 days preceding the filing of this application.

3. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

4. The following order complies with the Commission's Energy Efficiency Plan.

5. A public hearing is not necessary. Conclusions of Law

1. Applicants should be granted a dump truck carrier permit authorizing operations within and between points in the Counties of Los Angeles, Orange, San Diego, Imperial, and Riverside.

2. The following order should be effective on the date of signing to be consistent with other permit grants.

<u>O R D E R</u>

IT IS ORDERED that the Executive Director shall issue a dump truck carrier permit to Lee Roy White, Sr. and Helen Adeline White, partners doing business as L.R. White Trucking, authorizing operations within and between points in the Counties of Los Angeles, Orange, San Diego, Imperial, and Riverside.

This order is effective today.
