<u>O P I N I O N</u>

Frank Furtado, Jr. (applicant), an individual, doing business as Furtado Trucking, seeks a dump truck carrier permit. He proposes to transport dump truck commodities within and between the Counties of Humboldt, Lassen, Modoc, Plumas, Shasta, Tehama, and Trinity.

Applicant presently operates as an agricultural carrier under File T-134,873.

Applicant proposes to operate one truck and semitrailer unit in the proposed operation. Applicant has attached to the application a letter of support from a shipper of dump truck commodities for whom he proposes hauling approximately 1500 hours in the first year.

Notice of the filing of the application appeared in the Commission's Daily Calendar of April 5, 1982, and copies of the application were furnished to a number of shipper and carrier associations. No protests to the application have been received.

Findings of Fact

1. Applicant is a fit and proper person to receive a permit to operate as a dump truck carrier.

2. Applicant has sufficient operating knowledge and financial ability to initiate and continue the proposed operation.

- 3. Applicant's service:
 - a. Will not endanger the safety of the public or interfere with the use of the highways or impair the condition or maintenance of them either directly or indirectly.
 - b. Will not unnecessarily burden the public highways.
 - c. Is necessary to serve the public.
 - d. Will not impair the ability of presently permitted dump truck carriers to provide adequate service at the lowest possible reasonable rates.

4. Applicant has resided in the State of California for not less than 90 days preceding the filing of the application.

5. A public hearing is not necessary.

6. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

7. The following order complies with the guidelines of the Commission's Energy Efficiency Plan.

8. The following order should be effective today to be consistent with other highway permit authorizations.

Conclusion of Law

Applicant should be granted a dump truck carrier permit to operate between all points in the Counties of Humboldt, Lassen, Modoc, Plumas, Shasta, Tehama, and Trinity.

<u>ORDER</u>

IT IS ORDERED that the Executive Director shall issue to Frank Furtado, Jr., an individual, a dump truck carrier permit to operate between all points in the Counties of Humboldt, Lassen, Modoc, Plumas, Shasta, Tehama, and Trinity when applicant has complied with General Order Series 100.
