## <u>o p i n i o n</u>

Sam Lynn Green, dba Sam L. Green Truck & Service, has requested a permit as a dump truck carrier to operate in southern California. One shipper support letter has been furnished indicating that applicant can expect business in Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino Counties.

Our Transportation Division has examined the file, found that it contains information to support the required findings, and recommends that the application be granted to the extent supported by the shipper.

Copies of the application were served on California Carriers Association, California Dump Truck Owners' Association, California Trucking Association, Highway Carriers Association, Associated Independent Owner-Operators, Inc., Southern California Rock Products Association, Aggregates & Concrete Association of Northern California, Inc., Associated General Contractors, California Asphalt Pavement Association, and Engineering & Grading Contractors Association, Inc.

Notice of filing also appeared on the Commission's Daily Calendar of March 4, 1982. No protests have been received.

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## Findings of Fact

- 1. Applicant:
  - a. Is a fit and proper person to receive a permit to operate as a dump truck carrier.
  - b. Has sufficient operating knowledge and financial ability to initiate and continue with the proposed operation.
  - c. Has demonstrated that the privilege sought:
    - (1) Will not endanger the safety of the public or interfere with the public use of the public highways or impair the condition or maintenance of them, directly or indirectly.
    - (2) Will not unnecessarily burden the public highways.
    - (3) Is necessary to serve the public and will not impair the ability of presently permitted dump truck carriers to provide adequate service at the lowest possible reasonable rates.

2. Applicant has resided in the State of California for not less than 90 days preceding the filing of this application.

3. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

4. The following order complies with the Commission's Energy Efficiency Plan.

5. A public hearing is not necessary.

The Commission concludes that applicant should be granted a dump truck permit authorizing operations within and between points in the Counties of Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino.

The following order should be effective on the date of signing to be consistent with other permit grants.
