ORDER CORRECTING CLERICAL ERROR

On July 21, 1982 we issued Decision (D.) 82-07-102 which authorized the affected four public utilities to allow proportional rebates to its customers, in cases where it is physically impractical to install enough collectors for all units of a building, in order to meet the Commission's sizing requirements.

In Paragraph 3, Page 10 (mimeo) of the above-cited decision, the proportional rebate issue, dealing with the collectors as well as the solar-heated storage volume, was discussed in detail. The Commission concluded to provide proportional rebates to building owners where it would be physically impractical to install enough solar collectors or solar-heated storage volume requirements. Unfortunately, due to a clerical error, Ordering Paragraph 1 did not address the solar storage volume issue. Therefore, we now conclude that D.82-07-102 should be modified to allow proportional rebates to customers who, due to structural impracticalities, have been unable to install solar-heated storage facilities of the prescribed volume in a building.

Under Resolution A-4661,

IT IS ORDERED that:


1. Ordering Paragraph 1 of D.82-07-102 is amended as follows by addition of the words underlined:

"The affected public utilities shall allow proportional rebates in the case of buildings where it is physically impractical to install enough collectors or solar-heated storage volume to meet the Commission's sizing requirements for all units in the building."

2. In all other respects D.82-07-102 remains in full force and effect.

This order is effective today.
