ORDER CORRECTING CLERICAL ERROR

On September 22, 1982, we issued Decision (D.) 82-09-062 which authorized Southern California Gas Company (SoCal) to implement its low-income weatherization program as proposed on March 25, 1982 with certain modifications.

On pages 16 and 16a (mimeo.) of this decision, the Commission discussed at length the cash credit payments which are to be made to installers of direct weatherization packages. The Commission concluded that installers should receive up to \$536 for

installation of all "Big 6" measures. Unfortunately, due to clerical error, Ordering Paragraph 2 did not address this issue. Therefore, we now conclude that D.82-09-062 should be modified to authorize such payment.


Under Resolution A-4661,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Ordering Paragraph 2 of D.82-09-062 is amended by adding the following subparagraph:
 - d. SoCal shall pay installers of direct weatherization packages up to \$536 per low-income single-family unit for installation of all "Big 6" measures as follows: \$355 for attic insulation, \$125 for air duct insulation, \$25 for water flow control device, \$9 for water heater blanket, and \$22 for caulking/weatherstripping.
2. In all other respects D.82-09-062 remains in full force and effect.

This order is effective today.
