Robert C. Gebhardt Company (applicant), a California corporation, has requested a permit as a dump truck carrier to operate in the Counties of Plumas, Nevada, Placer, and Sierra.

Copies of the application were served on Aggregates & Concrete Association, Associated Independent Owner-Operators, Inc., California Asphalt Pavement Association, California Carriers Association, Minority Trucking Transportation Development Corporation, California Dump Truck Owners' Association, California Trucking Association, Highway Carriers Association, and Southern California Rock Products Association. Notice of filing of the application appeared on the Commission's Transportation Calendar of September 24, 1982. No protests have been received.

Applicant holds other authority as a heavy specialized carrier (T-89,265). It owns a tractor and specialized trailing equipment; acquisition of dump equipment is pending. Its most recent balance sheet is appended. The application is supported by a shipper, Conco Engineering Inc., San Luis Obispo, for operations within a 100 statute mile radius of Truckee, California, for an estimated 3,000 to 6,000 tons per year of sand, gravel, and asphalt. Findings of Fact

- 1. Applicant:
 - a. Is a fit and proper corporation to receive a permit to operate as a dump truck carrier.

- b. Has sufficient operating knowledge and financial ability to initiate and continue the proposed operation.
- c. Has demonstrated that the privilege sought:
 - Will not endanger the safety of the public or interfere with the public use of the public highways or impair the condition or maintenance of them, directly or indirectly.
 - (2) Will not unnecessarily burden the public highways.
 - (3) Is necessary to serve the public and will not impair the ability of presently permitted dump truck carriers to provide adequate service at the lowest possible reasonable rates.

2. Applicant is qualified to do business in California.

3. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

4. The following order complies with the Commission's Energy Efficiency Plan.

5. A public hearing is not necessary. Conclusions of Law

1. Applicant should be granted a dump truck carrier permit authorizing operations within and between points in the Counties of Plumas, Nevada, Placer, and Sierra.

2. The following order should be effective today to be consistent with other permit grants.

IT IS ORDERED that the Executive Director shall issue a dump truck carrier permit to Robert C. Gebhardt Company, a California corporation, authorizing operations within and between points in the Counties of Plumas, Nevada, Placer, and Sierra upon compliance with General Order Series 100.
