OPINION

John B. Ewles, Inc. (petitioner) requests modification of Minimum Rate Tariff 17-A (MRT 17-A) by adding a new production area in Orange County, with rates, for the transportation of recycled base material from the new area to delivery zones in Orange and Los Angeles Counties. Recycled base is the term used in the industry for the commodity described in Item 60 of MRT 17-A as "asphaltic or cement concrete, crushed or recrushed."

MRT 17-A names minimum rates for the transportation by dump truck carriers of certain commodities including rock, sand, and gravel and recycled base. The tariff contains zone rates which apply from defined production areas to designated delivery zones via a network of routes over most of the legally traversable highways in Southern California areas where the rates apply.

Petitioner alleges it ships substantial quantities of recycled base from the Orange County location each month, using the services of for-hire dump truck carriers. The shipments are usually destined to consignees located within the established system of delivery zones. Since zone rates are not presently available to petitioner for the transportation of recycled base, it pays transportation charges on the basis of hourly or distance rates.

Petitioner alleges that the use of hourly rates requires costly supervision; that the mileage rates it currently pays are inequitable and not comparable to zone rates; and that the establishment of zone rates for the transportation of its products will cause no rate discrimination because other producers of the same commodity in the same market area presently ship at zone rates to Los Angeles and Orange County delivery zones.

The Commission staff recommends that the petition be granted. The staff has developed round-trip times from petitioner's facility to nodes 40341 and 40332 of 3 and 5 minutes, respectively; it has determined actual miles to these same nodes of 0.2 and 0.9, respectively.

Staff has also developed a boundary description for publication in Southern California Production Area and Delivery Zone Directory 1, which includes petitioner's facility.

Staff has determined that petitioner ships about 15,000 tons monthly of recycled base material from this production facility. It believes petitioner's plant has adequate space for storage of materials and maneuvering of trucks during loading and unloading to qualify as a production area.

A copy of the petition was served on three trucking associations whose members perform dump truck operations in the involved areas and on three business associations whose members either produce or use rock products. No protest to the petition has been received.

The staff has brought to our attention that the descriptions of certain Santa Barbara and Monterey County delivery zones, and San Luis Obispo County production areas and delivery zones established by Decision (D.) 92203 contain typographical errors resulting in erroneous descriptions. The staff has prepared corrected descriptions of these areas and zones. They will be adopted and mailed with our decision granting this petition in order to avoid duplicate mailings.

Findings of Fact

- 1. MRT 17-A names minimum rates for the transportation by dump truck carriers of certain commodities via a network of routes over most legally traversable highways in Southern California.
- 2. Petitioner maintains a production facility, as described in the petition, where recycled base is produced.
- 3- Present MRT 17-A rates do not apply to transportation of recycled base from petitioner's facility.
- 4. The staff has developed information concerning traverse times from petitioner's facility to existing nodes. It recommends that the petition be granted.
- 5- The descriptions of certain Santa Barbara and Monterey County delivery zones and San Luis Obispo County production area and delivery zones, established by D.92203, require corrections.

- 6. The rates adopted in the following order will result in just, reasonable, and nondiscriminatory minimum rates for the transportation involved.
 - 7. A public hearing is not necessary.
- 8. The following order has no reasonably foreseeable impact on the energy efficiency of dump truck carriers.

 Conclusions of Law
- 1. The petition should be granted to the extent provided in the following order.
- 2. The effective date of this order should be today because there is an immediate need for this rate relief.
- 3. Correction of certain typographical errors in territorial descriptions established by D.92203 should be made and disseminated with this decision in order to avoid duplicate mailings.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. MRT 17-A (Appendix C of D.80578, as amended) is further amended by incorporating the supplement and revised tariff pages attached and listed in Appendix A, to become effective 5 days after today.
- 2. Southern California Production Area and Delivery Zone Directory 1 (Appendix A of D.65469, as amended) is further amended by incorporating the revised tariff pages attached and listed in Appendix B. to become effective 5 days after today.
- 3. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are also subject to D.80578 and D.65469, as amended, are authorized to establish in their tariffs the rates and routes necessary to conform with the further revisions ordered by this decision.

- 4. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of this order shall be filed on not less than 5 days notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than 60 days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.
- 5. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized by this order, are authorized to depart from the provisions of Public Utilities Code § 461.5 to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.
- 6. In all other respects D.80578 and D.65469, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.
- 7. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of this decision on every common carrier, or such carriers' authorized tariff publishing agents, performing transportation services subject to MRT 17-A.

8. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of the tariff amendments on each subscriber to MRT 17-A.

This order is effective today.

CONTUTATION OF CHARGES-WETURNED OR DIVERGED SKIPHENTS

If a shipment which has been transported to the point of destination shown on the shipping document specified in Section 17 may not be delivered at said point of destination, and if, pursuant to instructions from the consignor, the carrier either returns the shipment to point of origin or transports the shipment to another point of destination, the following charges shall apply for the total transportation performed:

- (a) When the shipment is returned to point of origin the total charge shall be computed at the outbound rate plus 22 cents per ton, minimum charge \$2.65.
- (b) When a shipment of a commodity (or commodities) named in Item 60 is diverted to a point of destination within the same system of sones as that in which the original point of destination is located, the applicable charge shall be computed at the rate from point of origin to the original point of destination shown on the shipping document plus 6 cents per ton for each mile or fraction thereof traversed from original point of destination to the point of destination where physical delivery of the shipment is accomplished.
