O P I N I O N

Frederick Douglas Dickens (applicant), an individual, seeks a dump truck carrier permit to operate in the Counties of Los Angeles, Orange and Ventura.

Applicant presently operates as a highway contract carrier under File T-126,687.

Applicant paid the filing fee with a check for \$500 drawn on the Security Pacific National Bank in Venice, California. The bank returned the check, marked "Not Sufficient Funds" on September 16, 1982. On September 28, 1982 the applicant was informed by letter that the application would be denied if the check was not redeemed and a \$5 service charge paid within 10 days. The check was not redeemed nor was the \$5 service charge paid.

Findings of Fact

1. Applicant submitted a \$500 check for his dump truck carrier permit application filing fee. The check was returned by the bank on September 16, 1982 marked "not sufficient funds."

2. On September 28, 1982 applicant was informed by letter that his application would be denied if his check was not redeemed within 10 days, together with payment of a \$5 service charge.

3. The check has not been redeemed.

Conclusion of Law

The application should be dismissed.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that the application of Frederick Douglas Dickens for a dump truck carrier permit is dismissed.

This order becomes effective 30 days from today.


