ORDER CORRECTING DECISION 83-05-050

A petition for modification of Decision (D.) 83-05-050 dated May 31, 1983 shows inadvertent errors and omissions in the text of the decision which should be corrected immediately under Resolution A-4661.

IT IS ORDERED that D.83-05-050 is corrected by:

- 1. Deleting the following text:

"The verified application shows that Seller owns and operates a water system in the unincorporated communities of Bryte, Broderick, and Elkhorn in Yolo County wholly within Buyer's boundaries. The original cost of the gross plant involved in the proposed transfer as of October 31, 1982 is \$9,650,880, the depreciation reserve is \$2,061,667, and net plant is \$7,589,213. The purchase price is \$5,900,000.

"Buyer will assume all public utility obligations of Seller including customer deposits and sums owing under main extension agreements."


- 2. Adding the following text in place of the deletion:

The verified application shows that Seller owns and operates a water system in the unincorporated communities of Bryte, Broderick, and Elkhorn in Yolo County wholly

within Buyer's boundaries. As of December 31, 1982, the original cost of the gross plant involved in the transfer is \$9,632,499, the depreciation reserve is \$2,061,023, and net plant is \$7,571,476. The purchase price is \$5,900,000. In addition Buyer will make additional payments to Seller of up to \$3,470,975 for the refund of customer advances for construction as said refunds become due. Buyer will assume all public utility service obligations of Seller.

This order is effective today.
