SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Decision (D.) 83-10-011 dated October 5, 1983 ordered Johnson Bros. Trucking, Inc. (Johnson) to pay a punitive fine of S5,000 within 40 days of the effective date of the order, and an additional fine of \$4,749.65, which represented undercharges due on transportation covered by the investigation performed by the Commission staff.

The Commission received a letter from Johnson's transportation representative on November 22, 1983, which requested that additional time be granted within which to pay the fines due. The letter alleges a financial setback and loans of \$300,000 as a reason for the request. The Commission's Transportation Division has reviewed the reasons advanced for postponement of payment of the fines and has no objection to the payment of the fines in the manner requested.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Respondent Johnson Bros. Trucking, Inc. shall pay the \$5,000 punitive fine imposed by D.83-10-011 in 10 monthly installments of \$500 due on or before the first day of each month beginning with the first day of February 1984.

2. Payment of the fine of \$4,749.65 will be temporarily deferred until respondent Johnson has had the opportunity to collect the undercharges from shippers. Sums collected will be payable to the Commission within 5 days of receipt by Johnson.
