Over the years, we have issued many orders in these matters in order to maintain control over the actions of San Miguel Telephone Company and its officers. By Decision No. 83816 dated December 10, 1974 Continental Telephone Corporation was authorized to control Redwood Empire Telephone Company (formally San Miguel Telephone Company of California). Since 1975, it appears that

Continental Telephone Corporation has managed the affairs of Empire Telephone Company in a manner that has obviated the need for day-to-day scrutiny of Redwood's operations.


Therefore, IT IS ORDERED that:


1. Case No. 8855 is dismissed.

3. The proceedings in Application No. 53576 are terminated.




