ORDER EXTENDING TIME

By Decision No. 85985 dated June 22, 1976 Chichester Transportation Co., Inc. was granted interim authority, pending hearing, to deviate from the minimum rates governing the transportation of cans, can ends, canned goods, tin plates, and pallets from and to various points in Northern California. The interim authority is scheduled to expire with January 1, 1977 unless sooner canceled, modified, or extended by further order of the Commission.

Applicant requests an extension of time in order to fully develop the necessary financial cost and traffic data prior to hearing of this matter. It is appropriate under the circumstances to extend the present authority to July 1, 1977 as requested by applicant.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The authority granted by Decision No. 85985 shall expire on July 1, 1977 unless sooner canceled, modified, or extended by further order of the Commission.

2. In all other respects Decision No. 85985 shall remain in full force and effect.
