DECISION NO. 86375

A petition for rehearing and suspension of Decision No. 86375 was filed by California Trucking Association on September 23, 1976. The Commission having considered each and every allegation of the petition, and being of the opinion that good cause for rehearing and suspension has been made to appear,

IT IS ORDERED that:


1. Rehearing of Decision No. 86375 is granted, said rehearing to be held before such Commissioner or Examiner, and at such time and place as shall be hereafter designated;
2. Pending rehearing, the Ordering Paragraphs of Decision No. 86375 shall be suspended;
3. Brake Delivery Service-Meier Transfer Service shall file a tariff amendment on not less than one (1) day notice to the Commission and to the public to become effective not later than ten (10) days after the effective date of this order, reestablishing its rates for the transportation involved in this proceeding at the level in effect immediately prior to October 22, 1976, with appropriate modifications to reflect the authority granted by Decision No. 86507.

The Executive Director is directed to cause a copy of this order to be served upon Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Agent.


The Executive Director is further directed to cause appropriate notice of the rehearing to be mailed at least ten (10) days prior to such rehearing.
