## OPINION AND ORDER

By these petitions, California Dump Truck Owners Association seeks the establishment of minimum rates in Minimum Rate Tariffs 7-A, 17-A and 20 for the transportation of "crushed or recrushed asphaltic or cement concrete" in dump truck equipment.

Petitioner states that the commodity is transported in bulk in dump trucks under identical conditions of loading, unloading and routing as are applicable to the component parts and other base materials such as decomposed granite, slag, gravel and batched material. Petitioner avers that the commodity is the same weight or slightly heavier than crushed rock of similar size and asserts that several thousand tons per month of this commodity are moving over the public highways in California. Petitioner alleges that there will be an increasing amount of this traffic as rock quarries in urban areas are depleted and dump sites to dispose of broken concrete material become filled. The certificate of service indicates that copies of the petitions were mailed to various interested parties on July 19, 1976. The petitions were listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of July 22, 1976. No objection to the granting of the petitions has been received.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that petitioner's proposal is reasonable and the resulting rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges for the transportation involved. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the petitions should be granted as set forth in the ensuing order.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 7-A (Appendix B to Decision 82061, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein to become effective December 25, 1976, Fifth Revised Page 8 and Fifth Revised Page 9 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Minimum Rate Tariff 17-A (Appendix C to Decision 80578, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein to become effective December 25, 1976, Fourth Revised Page 1-3 and Fourth Revised Page 1-4 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

3. Minimum Rate Tariff 20 (Appendix A to Decision 81799, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein to become effective December 25, 1976, Fourth Revised Page 1-3 and Fourth Revised Page 1-4 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

4. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject to Decisions 80578, 81799 and 32061, as amended, are hereby authorized to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein.

5. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of this order may be made effective not earlier than December 25, 1976, and may be made effective on not less than ten day's notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

6. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the amendments authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations, such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order, and schedules containing the amendments published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

7. In all other respects Decisions 80578, 81799 and 82061, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
