ORDER DENYING REHEARING  
AND MODIFYING DECISION NO. 86446

A petition for rehearing or modification of Decision No. 86446 has been filed by Pacific Messenger Service, Inc. After reviewing each and every allegation presented in the petition, the Commission is of the opinion that good cause for rehearing has not been shown to exist. However, the Commission finds that a portion of the relief granted by Decision No. 86446 is not supported by the allegations of the petition of Advanced Business Services, Inc. The Commission therefore concludes that Decision No. 86446 should be modified to delete the exemption granted for "medical and dental supplies and related equipment."

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Rehearing of Decision No. 86446 is hereby denied;
2. Sub-paragraph "a." of Ordering Paragraph 1 of Decision No. 86446 is modified to read:

C. 5441, Pet. 369; C. 5432, Pet. 915; C. 5439, Pet. 287 ns

- a. Human and animal blood, organs, specimens,  
medical and dental records and documents,  
X-ray photographs, drugs, prescription items  
and pharmaceuticals.
