RIGINAL

OPINION AND ORDER

Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (MRT 2) names minimum rates and rules for the statewide transportation of general commodities by highway carriers. By this petition, California Trucking Association seeks to have MRT 2 amended by establishing therein truckload exception ratings of Class 35.1 and Class 35.2 on shipments of frozen fruits and vegetables based on minimum weights of 36,000 pounds and 42,000 pounds, respectively.²

Petitioner states that there are greater volumes of this type of freight moving in California than elsewhere due to the agriculturally oriented economy of the State and the favorable year-round growing and packing conditions. Petitioner avers that its proposal recognizes the potential for traffic diversion to proprietary carriage and the levels of efficiency experienced by carriers in the loading processes involving these products. Petitioner declares that its proposal is reflective of the interests of shippers, carriers and the public generally.

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Copies of the petition were mailed to various chambers of commerce, shipper organizations and carrier representatives on or about October 7, 1976. The petition was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of October 12, 1976. Ted Peters Trucking Company, Inc., has informed the Commission by letter that it supports petitioner's proposal. No objection to the granting of the petition has been received.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that petitioner's proposal is reasonable and the resulting rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges for the transportation involved. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the petition should be granted and the effective date of this order should be the date hereof because there is an immediate need for this relief.

A minor change not related to the subject matter of the petition will be made in one of the tariff pages herein being revised.²

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (Appendix D to Decision 31606, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein to become effective January 17, 1977 Fiftieth Revised Page 6, Fifteenth Revised Page 9-A, Fifth Revised Page 27, Original Page 37-BBBB and Fourteenth Revised Page 37-C attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject to Decision 31606, as amended, are hereby authorized to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein.

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² Supplement 120 was inadvertently cancelled. Item 250 of MRT 2 will be revised to reflect the intent of Supplement 120. Also the term, "Saturday half-holidays," is obsolete and will be deleted from said item.

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3. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the fifth day after the effective date of this order and may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the ratings authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the ratings published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

5. In all other respects Decision 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.



(1) COLLECTION OF CHARGES	
(a) Except as otherwise provided in this rule, transportation and accessorial charges shall be collected by the carriers prior to rolinquishing physical possession of shipments entrusted to them for transportation.	
\emptyset (b) Upon taking precautions deemed by them to be sufficient to assure payment of charges within the credit period herein specified, carriers may relinquish pos- session of freight in advance of the payment of the charges thereon and may extend credit in the amount of such charges to those who undertake to pay them, such persons herein being called debors, for a period of 47 days, excluding Sundays and legal holidays ^{**} . When the freight hill covering a shipment is presented to the debor on or before the date of delivery, the credit period shall run from the first 12 o'clock midnight following delivery of the freight. When the freight bill is not presented to the debtor on or before the date of delivery, the credit period shall run from the first 12 o'clock midnight following the presentation of the freight bill.	
(c) Where a carrier has relinquished possession of freight and collected the amount of charges represented in a freight bill presented by it as the total amount of such charges, and another freight bill for additional charges is thereafter pre- sented to the debtor, the carrier may extend credit in the amount of such additional charges for a period of 30 calendar days to be computed from the first 12 o'clock midnight following the presentation of the subsequently presented freight bill.	
(d) Freight bills for all transportation and accessorial charges shall be pre- sented to the debtors within 7 calendar days from the first 12 o'clock midnight following delivery of the freight.	ø250
(c) Debtors may elect to have their freight bills presented by means of the United States mail, and when the mail service is so used the time of mailing by the Carrier, as evidenced by the postmark, shall be deemed to be the time of presentation of the freight bills.	
(f) The mailing by the debtor of valid checks, drafts, or money orders, which are satisfactory to the carrier, in payment of freight charges within the credit poriod allowed such debtor may be deemed to be the collection of the charges within the credit period for the purpose of these rules. In case of dispute as to the time of mailing, the postmark shall be accepted as showing such time.
