## SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

On June 8, 1976, the Commission's Freight Economics
Branch of its Transportation Division mailed to interested parties
a staff report which recommended the addition of wooden grape
stakes to the List A group commodity description for certain lumber
and forest products in Item 685 of Minimum Rate Tariff 2.

By letter dated September 21, 1976, the Commission's Executive Director informed interested parties that the staff believes, upon further evaluation of the matter, that wooden grape stakes should be added to the List C group commodity description of the aforementioned tariff item instead of the List A group commodity description. The Executive Director also stated that the staff would recommend to the Commission that the proposed tariff revision be accomplished by an exparte order and made subject to an expiration date of September 1, 1977.

According to the report grape stakes are moving in volume far greater than they were prior to 1970 when they were rated under the Commission's Exception Ratings Tariff 1. The density, unitized loads, value and transportability of wooden grape stakes are similar to those commodities described in Item 685 for which rates are provided in Items 690, 691 and 710 of Minimum Rate Tariff 2.

Written comments supporting the staff proposal were received from California Trucking Association (CTA) and Highway Carriers Association. CTA suggested that the proposed tariff change be made subject to a September 1, 1977 expiration date. No objection has been received concerning the report or the letter dated September 27, 1976.

The staff report and the Commission's above-referred-to letter of September 21, 1976, are received in evidence as Ex Parte Exhibit 0-29 in Case 5432 and the replies to said report are received in evidence as Ex Parte Exhibit 0-30 in Case 5432.

Upon consideration of the evidence in this proceeding, the Commission finds that the staff's proposal, as hereinafter modified by suggestion of one of the interested parties, is reasonable and justified. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that Minimum Rate Tariff 2 should be amended accordingly by the order herein and the effective date of this order should be the date hereof because there is an immediate need for this relief.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (Appendix D of Decision 31606, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective February 12, 1977, First Revised Page 5-B and Fifteenth Revised Page 51-C attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
- 2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject to Decision 31606, as amended, are hereby authorized to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein.
- 3. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of this order may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

- 4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the amendments authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations, such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order, and schedules containing the amendments published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.
- 5. In all other respects Decision 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.
