ORDER RESCINDING DECISION NO. 84922

By Decision 84922, dated September 16, 1975, in Application 55536, Frank T. Almaguer, Robert F. Brayton and Felipe Zepeda, doing business as A. B. & Z Labor Contractors, were granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate as a passenger stage corporation between Guadalupe, on the one hand, and points within a service area, on the other hand, that encompassed Arroyo Grande on the north, Santa Maria and Los Alamos on the east, and Lompoc and Santa Rosa County Park on the south.

In Ordering Paragraph 2 of Decision 84922, the applicant was required to file: (1) A written acceptance of the certificate granted on or before October 30, 1975; (2) Tariffs and timetables on or before January 14, 1976; and (3) Certificate of Insurance in compliance with the insurance requirements of General Order 101-C, on or before the day passenger stage operations commenced.

Applicant has not complied with any of these requirements.

It appears and the Commission finds that there is good cause for rescinding Decision 84922.

IT IS ORDERED that Decision 84922 is rescinded.

The Acting Executive Director of the Commission shall mail a certified copy of this order to Frank T. Almaguer, Robert F. Brayton and Felipe Zepeda, doing business as A. B. & Z Labor Contractors at 751 Guadalupe, Guadalupe, CA 93434, last known address as shown on the Commission's records.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
