$\underline{O P I N I O N}$

San Diego Economy Line, Inc. (SDEL) holds a certificate of public convenience and necessity as a passenger stage corporation in the San Diego area.¹/ Public hearing on Applications Nos. 55856, 56170, and 56269 was held on a consolidated record before Examiner Norman Haley at San Diego on October 14, 1976 and the matters were submitted.

On February 2, 1977 SDEL filed Application No. 57052 seeking to abandon all existing routes and pending applications. Application No. 57052 states that an agreement has been made to sell all certificated routes now held or operated by SDEL to the city of San Diego. Authority to sell or otherwise dispose of SDEL property necessary or useful in the performance of public utility services is required under Section 851 of the Public Utilities Code.

Eased on the record in Applications Nos. 55856, 56170, and 56269, it is clear that SDEL's remaining service is superfluous in the San Diego area. San Diego Transit Corporation (SDTC), a publicly operated bus transit system, and Greyhound Lines, Inc. (Greyhound) have extensive intrastate operations throughout the area, including operations between downtown San Diego and San Vsidro at the U.S.-Mexico border.

SDEL's east-west Route 1 between San Diego and Calavo Gardens (Challenge and Avocado Boulevards) has been under suspension by the Commission for a number of years as the result of alleged equipment failures and mechanical difficulties (Decisions Nos. 78684 (1971), 79861 (1972), 81252 (1973), and

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85096 (1975). The record shows that SDEL did not expect to reinstitute service on Route 1. SDTC operates over or substantially over the same route.

SDEL'S only active route is Route 2 between College Grove Shopping Center, located southwesterly of the community of Lemon Grove, and San Ysidro. SDEL'S president drives six round-trip schedules six days a week. SDEL owns only one operable bus, a 1953 Airide (48 passengers). The public can get service between cities and communities in the general area of College Grove Shopping Center, on the one hand, and downtown San Diego, on the other hand, by SDTC and Greyhound. By changing buses at San Diego, passengers can get frequent service to San Ysidro.

Findings

1. By Application No. 57052 SDEL seeks to abandon all cortificated routes and pending Applications Nos. 55856, 56170, and 56269.

2. The record, after hearing, in Applications Nos. 55856, 56170, and 56269 discloses that public convenience and necessity no longer require continuation of applicant's service in the San Diego area due to wide coverage of the area by other bus operations.

3. SDEL's passenger stage corporation certificate should be revoked and Applications Nos. 55856, 56170, and 56269 should be dismissed.

The Commission concludes that Application No. 57052 should be granted. A public hearing in Application No. 57052 is not necessary.

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<u>ORDER</u>

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Application No. 57052 is granted, and the operative rights authorized by Decisions Nos. 72433, 73865, and 76453 are revoked.

2. All tariffs and timetables presently on file with this Commission in applicant's name are canceled.

3. Applications Nos. 55856, 56170, and 56269 are dismissed.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
