Application of Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc. under the Shortened Procedure Tariff DOCKET to Dublish for and on behalf of Di Salvo Trucking Co. provisions resulting in increases because of publication of a new rule in connection with charges for unusual hours of service.

OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., Agent (WMTB), seeks authority, on behalf of Di Salvo Trucking Co. (Di Salvo) to publish charges for service performed between the hours of 5:15 P.M. and 8:15 A.M. Monday through Friday and for service performed Saturdays, Sundays, or holidays. 1

Applicant states that Di Salvo maintains regular hours of service between 8:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. Monday through Friday; however, shippers may request service at other than regular working hours. Di Salvo is willing to perform this service provided it is compensated for the additional expenses incurred.

Applicant asserts that increases resulting from the proposal herein would not increase its California intrastate gross revenue by as much as one percent. Applicant anticipates that the yearly revenue increase under its proposal should approximate \$2,000.

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of January 4, 1977. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

The proposed charges are set forth in Item 50 of WMTB Local, Joint and Proportional Freight and Express Tariff No. 111, Cal. P.U.C. No. 15.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that increases resulting from applicant's proposal are justified. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the application should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., Agent, is hereby authorized, on behalf of Di Salvo Trucking Co., to publish an amendment in its Local, Joint and Proportional Freight and Express Tariff No. 111, Cal.P.U.C. No. 15, as specifically proposed in the application.
- 2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.
- 3. The authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.

The order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
