O P I N I O N

Thomas Michael Sullivan, doing business as M & S Auto-Hire & Limousine Service, requests renewal of a charter-party carrier of passenger permit. The only protest was filed by the City and County of San Francisco and was withdrawn by letter dated June 16, 1977 upon an understanding with applicant that he would not solicit customers on the premises of the San Francisco International Airport and that he would show a valid waybill to Airport personnel upon request, which lists the name, date, flight, and arrival time of any prearranged customer he is picking up at the airport.

Applicant owns and operates a 1966 Cadillac limousine and indicated a net worth in the amount of \$59,250.

The Commission concludes that the permit should be issued.

Applicant is placed upon notice that if he has occasion to take passengers to or from the San Francisco International Airport, he is to fully comply with all airport rules and regulations governing such operations. Failure to comply may result in a denial or a restriction against such service upon a request for renewal.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The Executive Director of the Commission shall issue a charter-party carrier of passenger permit to Thomas Michael Sullivan as described by Public Utilities Code Section 5384(b).

2. When applicant has occasion to take passengers to or from the San Francisco International Airport, he shall fully comply with all airport rules and regulations governing such operations.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
