ORDER OF REVOCATION

By Decision 74637, dated September 17, 1968, in Application 50370, Victor Lee Water Transportation Co., Inc., was granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate a vessel common carrier to transport persons between Marineland Pier, on the one hand, and Public Landing in San Pedro, on the other hand, during the period from June 1 to October 1 of each year and on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays for the remainder of the year.

On May 27, 1977, the Commission staff sent a letter to the carrier advising that it had not filed its Annual Report for 1976. The Commission staff received a reply on June 14, 1977 from the carrier stating: "We closed our operation in May 1976 and sold our boats. We no longer need our franchise".

It appears and the Commission finds that these matters constitute good cause for the revocation of the aforenamed certificate and that such revocation would not be adverse to the public interest. The Commission, therefore, concludes that the certificate should be revoked and that tariffs and timetables applicable to the service thereunder be canceled.

IT IS ORDERED that the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate as a VESSEL COMMON carrier authorized by Decision 74637 in Application 50370, is hereby revoked and all effective tariffs and timetables on file with the Commission in the name of Victor Lee Water Transportation Co., Inc., are canceled upon the effective date of this order.
