In the matter of the application of SOUTHERN PACIFIC TRANSPORTATION COMPANY of or an order authorizing the construction at grade of an industrial spur track in, upon and across Alton Avenue in the City of Santa Ana, County of Orange, State of California.

OPINION

Southern Pacific Transportation Company requests authority to construct an industrial spur track at grade across Alton Avenue in the City of Santa Ana, Crange County.

The industrial spur track will serve the facility of Cadillac Fairview/California, Inc. which is constructed on industrial land at the southwest corner of Alton Avenue and Fairview Street.

Notice of the application was published in the Commission's Daily Calendar on April 25, 1977. No protests have been received. A public hearing is not necessary.

FINDINGS

After consideration, the Commission finds:

- 1. Applicant should be authorized to construct an industrial spur track at grade across Alton Avenue in the City of Santa Ana, Orange County, at the location and substantially as shown by the plan attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing BK-522.71-C.
- 2. Construction of the crossing should be equal or superior to Standard No. 1 (General Order 72-B).

- 4. Protection at the crossing should be two Standard
- 5. For a period not to exceed one year from the date of this order, protection at the crossing may be two Standard No. 1-R signs (General Order 75-C) and no on-rail vehicle should be operated over said crossing unless it is first brought to a stop and traffic on the street protected by a member of the crew or other competent employee of the railroad acting as a flagman. Written instructions should be issued by the railroad to trainmen, operating over said crossing, to comply with said flagging instructions. Copy of said instructions should be filed with the Commission within thirty days after installation of said crossing. Flagging procedures outlined herein should remain in full force until the automatic protection required herein is installed and operative.
- 6. Construction cost of the crossing and installation cost of the automatic protection should be borne by the applicant.
- 7. Maintenance of the crossing should be in accordance with General Order 72-B. Maintenance of the automatic protection should be borne by the applicant.
- 8. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

CONCLUSIONS

On the basis of the foregoing findings, we conclude that the application should be grante as set forth in the following order:

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Southern Pacific Transportation Company is authorized

to construct an industrial spur track at grade across Alton Avenue in the City of Santa Ana, Orange County, as set forth in the findings of this decision.

2. Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing.

This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if the above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be 20 days after the date hereof.
