OPINION AND ORDER

Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (MRT 2) names minimum rates and rules for the statewide transportation of general commodities by highway carriers. By Petitions 975, 976 and 978, California Trucking Association respectively seeks to amend MRT 2 by: (1) establishing an exception rating on rose bushes in a dormant growing state; (2) providing for a stretch wrap method of packaging for shipments of canned goods; and (3) establishing an exception rating on frozen prepared dinners or pies.

Petitioner in Petition 975 states that it seeks the establishment of a truckload exception rating on rose bushes at a higher minimum weight with a lower class rating than is set forth in the governing classification. This higher minimum weight will encourage shippers to load carrier's equipment to full visible capacity. The result will be reduced equipment needs for both carriers and shippers.

Petitioner in Petition 976 asserts that stretch wrap is a unique process of mechanically stretching special plastic film and wrapping it around a palletized load. The stretch film is applied from a continuous roll under tension and the end result is like a series of elastic bands wrapped around the load. This method securely encases and protects the load during shipment. Petitioner declares that because of the still innovative nature of the stretch wrap process, petitioner proposes to limit this authorization to those

instances where a Test Shipment Permit has been issued authorizing the use of stretch wrap and to expire May 31, 1978.

Petitioner in Petition 978 proposes to amend the provisions of Item 351 to extend the reduced truckload ratings to frozen prepared dinners or pies. Petitioner submits that the transportation characteristics of the named frozen prepared foods are identical to the transportation characteristics of the commodities now listed in Item 351.

Copies of the petitions were mailed to various chambers of commerce, shipper organizations and carrier representatives on or about May 27, June 1, and June 6, 1977. The petitions were listed on the Commission's Daily Calendars of June 3, and June 10, 1977. No objection to the granting of the petitions has been received.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that petitioner's proposals are reasonable and the resulting minimum rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges for the transportation involved. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the petitions should be granted as set forth in the ensuing order and the effective date of this order should be the date hereof because there is an immediate need for this rate relief.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (Appendix D to Decision 31606, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective twenty-five days after the date hereof, the revised pages contained in Appendix A, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject also to Decision 31606, as amended, are authorized to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered by this decision.

3. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of this order may be made effective not earlier than twenty-five days after the date hereof and may be made effective

on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the amendments authorized by this order, are authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the amendments published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

5. In all other respects, Decision 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.
