ORDER OF REVOCATION

By Decision No. 84880, dated September 10 1975, in
 Application No. 55690, William J. Federici, an individual doing
 business as Federici's Stage Line, was granted a Certificate of
 Public Convenience and Necessity to operate as a Passenger Stage
 Corporation between the Cities of Oakland, San Leandro and Hayward,
 on the one hand, and the U.S. Post Office, U.S. Navy Base and
 U.S. G.S.A. in San Bruno and The Zellerbach Paper Company in
 South San Francisco, on the other hand.

Since June 23, 1977, William J. Federici has had no
 evidence on file with this Commission showing adequate protection
 against liability imposed by law for payment of damages for personal
 injury or property damages, as required by General Order No. 101-C.

The Commission staff notified him by letters
 dated May 17 and June 10, 1977, of impending suspension of his
 authority for failure to maintain on file evidence of adequate liability
 insurance with the Commission.

By registered letter dated June 23, 1977, Mr. Federici was notified that his authority was suspended for failure to maintain on deposit evidence of adequate liability insurance with the Commission.

On September 7, 1977, the Commission staff sent a registered letter to him requesting that he respond to our letter before September 27, 1977, by either placing his authority under voluntary suspension, filing evidence of adequate liability insurance with this Commission or subjecting his authority to revocation. The Commission staff has not received any response from Mr. Federici.

It appears and the Commission finds that these matters constitute good cause for the revocation of the aforementioned certificate and that such revocation would not be adverse to the public interest. The Commission, therefore, concludes that the certificate should be revoked and that tariffs and timetables applicable to the service thereunder should be canceled.

IT IS ORDERED that the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate as a Passenger Stage Corporation authorized by Decision No. 84880 in Application No. 55690 is hereby revoked and all effective tariffs and timetables on file with the Commission in the name of William J. Federici, an individual doing business as Federici's Stage Line, are canceled upon the effective date of the order.

The Executive Director shall mail a certified copy of this order to William J. Federici, 200 Linden Avenue, #1 in San Bruno, CA 94066, last known address as shown on the Commission's records.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
