OPINION AND ORDER

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Exception Ratings Tariff 1 (ERT 1) contains various exception ratings which apply in lieu of those named in National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-D and govern various minimum rate tariffs making specific reference thereto.¹

By the above petitions, California Trucking Association seeks to amend Item 1850 by adding to it commodities described as Collators (as an integral part or an attachment to a Copying, Duplicating or Reproducing machine) and by inserting therein Note 4 with a statement allowing for the inclusion of Machinery, Equipment, Parts, Accessories and Supplies when they do not exceed ten percent of the total weight.

Petitioner states that it is an industry practice to include with shipments of reproducing machines additional equipment, parts, accessories and supplies as are necessary to the performance of a complete reproducing process. Such additional equipment must be packaged in accordance with the rules provided in the National Motor Freight Classification; otherwise, it would be subject to the penalty

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set forth in Item 423 of said classification. Moreover, the aforementioned equipment, parts, accessories and supplies are generally shipped at full value while the commodities described in Item 1850 of ERT 1 are shipped pursuant to a released valuation of 50 cents per pound. This difference has created many problems for both the shippers and carriers.

The petitions were listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of September 20, 1977. No objection to the granting of the petitions has been received.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that petitioner's proposals are reasonable and justified to the extent hereinafter indicated. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the petitions should be granted as set forth in the ensuing order.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Exeption Ratings Tariff 1 (Appendix A to Decision 66195, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein to become effective twenty-five days after the date hereof, Forty-first Revised Page 3 and Fifth Revised Page 27-WWWW attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject to Decision 66195, as amended, are hereby authorized to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein.

3. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

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4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the amendments authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the amendments published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and shorthaul departures and to this order.

5. In all other respects Decision 66195, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty-days after the date hereof.
