OPINION AND ORDER

Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (MRT 2) names minimum rates and rules for the statewide transportation of general commodities by highway carriers. By Petitions 970 and 971 and 985 through 987, California Trucking Association (CTA) seeks to amend MRT 2 in the following manner:

Petition 970 - to provide truckload exception ratings of Class 35.1, 35.2 and 35.3 at 36,000, 42,000 and 45,000 pounds minimum weight, respectively, for chewing gum.

Petition 971 - to provide a less than truckload exception ratings for cushions or pads which are over one inch but not over three inches in thickness.

Petition 985 - to provide truckload exception ratings of Class 35.3 and 35.4, respectively, at 48,000 pounds minimum weight for cement and asbestos fiber conduit or pipe.

Petition 986, as amended - to provide truckload exception ratings of Class 35.3 and 35.4 at 50,000 pounds minimum weight for certain roofing material commodities.

Petition 987 - to provide a truckload exception rating of 85% of Class 35.4 at 48,000 pounds minimum weight for beer.

Petitioner states the proposed amendments will encourage the shipment of larger quantities, result in better utilization of carrier's equipment and will provide transportation savings to the shippers.

Copies of the petitions were mailed to various chambers of commerce, shipper organizations and carrier representatives on or about April 29, May 3 and July 15, 1977. The petitions were listed on the Commission's Daily Calendars of May 5, July 19 and October 13, 1977. An objection was filed by the California Beer Wholesalers Association, Inc., in a letter dated October 26, 1977, requesting that Petition for Modification 987 be set for hearing. The protest contains no substantive grounds for denial of said petition. It will be denied.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that petitioner's proposals are reasonable and the resulting minimum rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges for the transportation involved. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the petitions should be granted as set forth in the ensuing order and the effective date of this order should be the date hereof because there is an immediate need for this rate relief.

Certain commodities, that should be listed in the Index of Commodities in MRT 2 relating to these petitions, have been published in tariff pages per Decision 88046 in order to save tariff printing and mailing costs.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (Appendix D to Decision 31606, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective twenty-five days after the date hereof, the revised pages contained in Appendix A, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject also to Decision 31606, as amended, are authorized to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered by this decision.

3. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of this order may be made effective not earlier than twenty-five days after the date hereof and may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the amendments authorized by this order, are authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the amendments published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders.

5. In all other respects, Decision 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.
