California Trucking Association Petition for Modification of Minimum Rate Tariff 2

OPINION AND ORDER

California Trucking Association Petition for Modification of Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (MRT 2) names minimum rates and rules for the statewide transportation of general commodities by highway carriers. By this petition, California Trucking Association seeks the establishment in MRT 2 of an exception rating of Class 35.3 on telephone materials and supplies in mixed shipments of five or more commodities individually named in the governing classification for use in the installation and maintenance of facilities for the transmission and distribution of telephone service to the public, subject to a minimum weight of 40,000 pounds for each unit of carrier's equipment from Sunset Whitney Ranch.¹

Petitioner states that hundreds of individually described commodities are shipped as part of the support system for installation and maintenance of telephone equipment and services. Petitioner points out that the rules in Minimum Rate Tariff 2 compel the listing on the bills of lading of the individual commodity description in terms of the governing classification, which petitioner declares is time consuming and costly for both shippers and carriers.

Consequently, petitioner submits its proposal for the establishment of revised tariff provisions which would minimize costly clerical expenses for both shippers and carriers alike without causing substantive changes in overall carrier revenue levels.

Petitioner proposes to establish a single class exception rating applicable to mixtures of the varied commodities, as set forth in Exhibits A and B to the petition. Exhibit A sets forth a list of commodities obtained from another tariff (Rocky Mountain Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., Tariff ICC RMB 329-A) which settles similar problems by the application of a single generic description, as proposed by the petitioner.

Petitioner asserts that to promote shipper and carrier efficiencies it proposes the following: (1) assure a reasonable minimum weight, such as 40,000 pounds, for individual unit of carrier's equipment; (2) to either disallow or drastically limit the use of split pickup and split delivery services; (3) to subject the shipment to a released valuation of 50 cents per pound, per article or to one-half of actual value, whichever is less.

Petitioner claims that although there will be reductions in the truckload rating of all commodities, there will be no appreciable revenue gain or loss to the carrier and no added expense to the shipper. However, there will be some significant savings in clerical and administrative costs, which will also provide substantial increase in efficiency for shippers and carriers.

Petitioner seeks to establish the exception rating and tariff provisions applicable to the transportation from a single named origin point. It has not been the policy of the Commission to establish exception ratings for transportation from or to particular points which could be considered discriminatory toward other shippers of similar commodities. Appropriately, the order which follows, will provide equal opportunities for the tariff provisions to apply from any point within the State under these same conditions.

Copies of the petition were mailed to various chambers of commerce, shipper organizations, carrier associations and other interested parties on or about October 26, 1977. The petition was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of October 28, 1977. No objection to the granting of the petition has been received.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that the petitioner's proposal is reasonable and justified to the extent herein-after indicated. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the petition should be granted as set forth in the ensuing order.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (Appendix D to Decision 31606, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein to become effective twenty-five days after the date thereof, the revised pages contained in Appendix A, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject to Decision 31606, as amended, are hereby authorized to establish in their tariffs the revisions necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein.
3. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, or not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.
4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the amendments authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations, such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order, and schedules containing the amendments published under this authority shall make reference to the prior order authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that the petitioner's proposal is reasonable and justified to the extent herein-after indicated. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the petition should be granted as set forth in the ensuing order.

To whom it may concern, IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (Appendix D to Decision 31606, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein to become effective twenty-five days after the date thereof, the revised pages contained in Appendix A, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject to Decision 31606, as amended, are hereby authorized to establish in their tariffs the revisions necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein.

3. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the amendments authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations, such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order, and schedules containing the amendments published under this authority shall make reference to the prior order authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

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5. In all other respects Decision 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.



COMMISSIONER RICHARD D. GRAVELLE, CONCURRING

I concur.

It is appropriate to point out that this order grants the relief requested by CTA (a change in the classification for the particular commodities) to the extent that this Commission has traditionally allowed. CTA requested the proposed new class rates for shipments between certain specific points, whereas the Commission's order allows the new classification rating for the commodities if they move anywhere in the state. It would be discriminatory to have in our tariffs different class ratings for the same commodities, limited by the origin of the shipment. Had individual carriers requested a deviation from the applicable minimum rates pursuant to Section 3666 of the Public Utilities Code, rates could have been authorized that applied only for certain shippers between specified points. CTA by asking for a change in the classification should have known, that such a change would have to be available for all carriers and shippers. The Commission is properly granting CTA the relief requested to the extent that is legally and equitably possible.
