ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Complainants, Ruth and Irving Chamkis, seek an order requiring defendant, The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company (Pacific), to return a deposit to establish credit of \$135 plus interest and an \$11 reconnection charge which were allegedly not collected in accordance with Pacific's tariffs.

In its answer to the complaint Pacific offered to refund the amount of the deposit and reconnection charge plus seven percent interest which would, in their opinion, satisfy the complaint.

A statement of account, furnished at the request of Administrative Law Judge Johnson and accepted herewith as Exhibit 1, shows a refund voucher for the deposit and interest was sent complainants on November 28, 1977 and a credit to their account for the reconnection charge was made on December 7, 1977.

By letter dated December 21, 1977 complainants were advised that it appeared the complaint had been satisfied and that unless we were informed by January 15, 1978 the information was incorrect, the complaint would be dismissed with prejudice. No response was received from complainants. We therefore find that the complaint has been satisfied and should be dismissed with prejudice.

IT IS ORDERED that Case No. 10399 is dismissed with prejudice.

The effective date of this order shall be thirty days after the date hereof.
