Application of 24-Hour Airport Express for a charter-party carrier of passengers permit, between various points and places in Los Angeles and Orange Counties and Los Angeles International and Orange County Airports. (TCP 325-P)

ORDER EXTENDING EXPIRATION DATE OF PERMIT

By D.88061, as modified by D.88381, Charter-Party Carrier of Passengers Permit No. TCP 325-P held by 24-Hour Airport Express, Inc. (applicant) was continued in effect for sixty days after February 13, 1978.

By A.57765, applicant seeks to separate certain of its operations and to perform them as a passenger stage corporation, with the remainder being performed as a charter-party carrier. A.57765 of applicant has been consolidated for hearing with the application of another party also seeking passenger stage authority between points in some of the same territory. The two applications have been protested by other parties. Hearing on the passenger stage certificate requests commenced on February 17, 1978, and further hearing has been scheduled beyond the date applicant's charter-party permit is scheduled to expire. At the hearing on February 17 applicant's attorney urged that something be done to prevent lapse of the company's charter-party authority now scheduled to expire on April 14, 1978.

Under the circumstances, the expiration date of applicant's charter-party permit should be further continued to permit orderly disposition of its passenger stage certificate application now pending.

IT IS ORDERED that Charter-Party Carrier of Passengers Permit No. TCP 325-P held by 24-Hour Airport Express, Inc. is continued in effect until ~~December 31~~ ^{July 14}, 1978 at which time it shall expire, unless further extended by the Commission.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.
