OPINION AND ORDER

Trammell Crow Distribution Corporation of Los Angeles is a public utility warehouseman for the storage of general commodities at City of Commerce, California. The rates, rules and regulations governing applicant's operations are contained in its Warehouse Tariffs Nos. 1 and 2.

Applicant requests authority to increase rates and charges by approximately 7 percent. The requested rate increase has been determined by applicant without consultation or agreement with any other warehouseman.

Applicant alleges that its present rates do not yield sufficient revenue to allow it to conduct its warehouse operations at a reasonable profit.

Applicant's rates were last adjusted pursuant to authority granted by Decision 86588 dated November 2, 1976 in Application 56648.

Applicant further alleges that additional revenue is required because of increased costs in all phases of operation, the most significant being the increased cost of plant and clerical labor.

Exhibit B, attached to the application, contains revenue and expense data for the test year ending December 31, 1977 together with adjustments to reflect the proposed increase in revenue should the application be granted. The exhibit discloses that during the test year applicant realized a profit of \$66,387 and an operating ratio of 91.98 percent. When the test year is adjusted to reflect current costs, the profit is reduced to \$21,801 and the operating ratio is 97.77%. Had the sought rates been in effect during the

test year applicant would have realized a profit of \$95,540 and an operating ratio of 90.93 percent.

Notice of the proposed increase was sent to each of applicant's storers. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

FINDINGS

1. Applicant's rates were last adjusted by Decision 86588 dated November 2, 1976, in Application 56648.
2. Since applicant's rates were last adjusted it has experienced increases in operating expenses, the most significant being the increased cost of plant and clerical labor.
3. Under the increase sought herein applicant estimates it will realize additional revenue of \$68,915 and an operating ratio of 90.93 percent.
4. The proposed increases in applicant's rates and charges have been shown to be justified.
5. A public hearing is not necessary.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Trammell Crow Distribution Corporation of Los Angeles is authorized to establish the increased rates proposed in Application 57995. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.
2. The authority shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.
3. The authority granted by this order is subject to the express condition that applicant will never urge before this Commission in any proceeding under Section 734 of the Public Utilities Code, or in any other proceeding, that this opinion and order constitute a finding of fact of the reasonableness of any particular rate or charge. The filing of rates and charges pursuant to this order will be construed as a consent to this condition.

The effective date of this order shall be thirty days after the date hereof.
