SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

It has come to the Commission's attention that Decision 89029 does not reflect the intent of said decision with respect to the application of surcharges to rates for lumber, poles and woodchips in Items 635, 636, 695 and 729.

Pursuant to Resolution A-4661, IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (Appendix D to Decision 31606, as amended), is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective August 5, 1978, Supplement 138 and Eighteenth Revised Page 51-C, First Revised Page 51-CCCC and First Revised Page 51-CCCC attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
- 2. Tariff publications of common carriers shall be made effective not earlier than August 5, 1978 on one day's notice to the Commission and to the public.
- 3. In all other respects Decision 39029, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

APPLICATION OF SURCHARGE

Except as otherwise provided, compute the amount of charges in accordance with the rates and rules in the tariff (including any surcharges otherwise applicable) and increase the amount so computed as follows:

- By twenty-five percent (25%) on charges computed upon rates subject to minimum weights of 40,000 pounds and over.
- By twenty-eight percent (28%) on charges computed upon rates subject to minimum weights of 10,000 pounds but less than 40,000 pounds.
- By thirty-one (31%) on all other rates and charges.

For purposes of disposing of fractions under provisions hereof, fractions of less than one-half cent shall be dropped and fractions of one-half cent or greater shall be increased to the next higher whole cent.

"ONOTE 2 .- Each shipment must be loaded by the consignor and unloaded by the consigned with power or mechanical equipment, at no expense to the carrier. At shipper's or consigned's request, power or mechanical equipment, which is an integral part of the **BORS** carrier's equipment, may be used to load and/or unload without liability for damage to the carrier; the use of such equipment is restricted to that work performed by a single carrier employee (driver) within, on or beside the carrier's equipment (including roll-off unloading). In the event the carrier must provide forklift service, charges as made for each unit of carrier's equipment used. The free time shall be computed from the time of arrival of carrier's equipment at the place of loading or unloading until loading or unloading is completed and carrier's equipment is released. Excess loading or unloading time shall be charged for at rates named in Item 145 of this tariff. Place of loading means a particular street address or other designation of a factory, store, warehouse, place of business, private residence, construction camp or the like. FOONOTE 4.—The provisions of Items 170-173 (Split Delivery) shall apply except that split deliveries may be ordered by phone provided the written document required by paragraph 2 of Item 172 is prepared within a period of 48 hours computed from 12:01 a.m. of the day following the phone order, Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays are ex-cluded. The carrier shall record the time and date of the phone order. The time and date of the phone order and shipping document will be retained with the carrier's copy of the freight bill. Failure of the carrier to make and retain the required documentation shall result in each component part of the split delivery shipment being rated as a separate shipment under other provisions of this tariff. Split delivery shipments shall be limited to a maximum of five (5) component parts. NOTE 5 .-- Rates apply on Wood Fibreboard Hardboard only when released to a value of 20 cents per pound, per article. Shipper must enter the following statement on the bill of lading or shipping document: "The agreed or declared value of the Wood Fibreboard Hardboard is hereby specifically stated by the shipper to be 20 cents per pound, per article." If the shipper fails or declines to declare such value in writing, other provisions of this tariff shall apply.
