## ORDER OF DISMISSAL

In Case No. 9625 we instituted an investigation into the promulgation of a general order providing for procedures and standards to be followed for the interconnection of customer-provided communication terminal equipment to the telecommunication facilities of intrastate telephone utilities. In Decision No. 82412 dated January 29, 1974, complaint cases involving the interconnection of customer-provided ancillary and data equipment were consolidated with Case No. 9625.

The adoption of General Order No. 138 in Decision No. 84364 dated April 22, 1975, as modified by Decisions Nos. 85791, 87620, and 87920 and Commission Resolution No. T-9826 dated June 28, 1978 resolves the issues for the interconnection of customer-provided equipment.

Accordingly, the matters consolidated with Case No. 9625 should be dismissed.

IT IS ORDERED that Cases Nos. 9177, 9265, 9271, 9323, 9360, 9546, 9600, 9610, 9637, and 9652 are dismissed without prejudice.
