ORDER OF DISMISSAL

These three cases were consolidated because of interrelated subject matter. Early in the proceeding the parties advised the administrative law judge that, depending upon the resolution of issues in Case No. 10256, the issues in Cases Nos. 10127 and 10128 might become moot.

On September 6, 1978, the Commission issued Decision No. 89323 which disposed of all issues in Case No. 10256, and terminated

proceedings in that case. This decision ended our program of regulation for hotel and motel telephone surcharges.

By the terms of Decision No. 89323, Cases Nos. 10127 and 10128 remained off calendar. On the date the decision was issued, the ALJ sent a letter to all appearances asking to be notified within 30 days if any further proceedings would be necessary in Cases Nos. 10127 and 10128, and stating that if no such notification was received, dismissal would be recommended.

More than 30 days have passed and no party has notified the ALJ that any further proceedings are desired in either Case No. 10127 or Case No. 10128. We accordingly find that these cases should be dismissed.

IT IS ORDERED that Case No. 10127 and Case No. 10128 are dismissed.

The effective date of this order shall be thirty days after the date hereof.
