## FIFTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

It has come to the Commission's attention that Decision 89355 does not reflect the intent of said decision with respect to the 20,000 pound scale of rates in Item 640 of Minimum Rate Tariff 2 in Decision 88693 dated April 11, 1978. Item 869 should also be amended to correct an error.

Item 640 provides a scale of rates for the transportation of empty cans and can ends. The rates were composed of segments of two different class rate scales and the adjustment of the surcharge into the scales was based on the premise that a single rate scale was involved. The proper adjustment requires the recognition of the blend of two rate scales, which will maintain the original basis of the rates and results in minor increases and reductions.

Item 869 provides a truckload rating on sewer pipe or sewer pipe fittings, subject to Notes 1 through 5. Note 5 was inadvertently omitted from this item.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (Appendix D to Decision 31606, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective January 6, 1979, Fifth Revised Page 48-C and First Revised Page 66-N-26, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications of common carriers shall be made effective not earlier than January 6, 1979 on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and to the public.

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3. In all other respects, Decision 89355, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

4. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of this decision on every common carrier, or such carriers' authorized tariff publishing agents, performing transportation services subject to Minimum Rate Tariff 2.

5. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of each of the tariff amendments on each subscriber to Minimum Rate Tariff 2.
