## SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision 89882; entered today in Case 5432 et al., authorized amendment of Minimum Rate Taxiffs 1-B, 2, 7-A, 8-A, 9-B, 14-A, 15 and 19 to cover transportation by agricultural carriers. The decision also provided that Minimum Rate Taxiffs 1-B and 19 should be amended by separate order to avoid duplication of taxiff distribution.

### IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Minimum Rate Tariff 1-B (Appendix B of Decision 65834, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective February 1, 1979, Eighth Revised Title Page, and Twenty-fourth Revised Page 11, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
- 2. Minimum Rate Tariff 19 (Appendix A of Decision 41363, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective February 1, 1979, Eighth Revised Title Page, and Twentyninth Revised Page 12 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

- 3. The rates, charges and rules set forth in Minimum Rate Tariffs 1-B and 19 are established and approved as the just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges to be assessed, charged and collected, and the rules to be observed by all agricultural carriers as defined in the Highway Carriers' Act for the transportation of fresh fruits, nuts, vegetables, logs and unprocessed agricultural commodities in carrier's equipment between the points for which rates are provided in said tariffs.
- 4. In all other respects, Decisions 41363 and 65834, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.
- 5. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of this decision on every common carrier, or such carriers' authorized tariff publishing agents, performing transportation services subject to Minimum Rate Tariffs 1-B and 19.

# DEFINITION OF TECHNICAL TERMS (Items 10, 11 and 12)

ARMORED CAR means any motor truck and/or other highway vehicle which has been armored with bullet resistant metal and/or bullet proof glass, and which is manned by an armed crew.

\*\*CARRIER means a radial highway common carrier, a highway contract carrier, an agricultural carrier, a cement contract carrier or a dump truck carrier as defined in the Highway Carriers' Act.

CARRIER'S EQUIPMENT means any motor truck or other self-propolled highway vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, or any combination of such highway vehicles, operated by the currier.

CITY DELIVERY or CITY DELIVERIES means transportation of property to retail stores or direct consumors of the property transported when the shipment originates within the territory covered by this tariff at other than a carrier's depot, dock, wharf, pier, or landing.

COMMISSION means the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California.

COMMON CARRIER RATE means any intrastate rate or rates of any common carrier or common carriers, as defined in the Public Utilities Act, lawfully on file with the Commission and in effect at time of shipment.

COURTER SERVICE is defined as operations having the following characteristics: (a)  $\lambda$  carrier vehicle fleet consisting of only vehicles having a licensed weight of 4,500 pounds or less; (b) Delivery shall be made within 24 hours after pickup.

DANGEROUS ARTICLES means articles described in the Hazardous Materials Turiff.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS TARIFF means Hazardous Materials Tariff  $\Lambda T \Lambda$  lll-C, Cal POC 13, of American Trucking Associations, Inc., Agent.

DEBTOR means the person obligated to pay the freight charges to the carrier, whether consignor, consignee or other party.

ESCORT SERVICE means the furnishing of pilot cars or vehicles by a carrier as may be required by any governmental agency to accompany a shipment for highway safety.

COVERNING CLASSIFICATION means National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-E, including supplements thereto or reissues thereof when the provisions of such supplements or reissues have been approved by the Commission.

HOLIDAYS means New Year's Day (January 1), Washington's Birthday (the third Monday in February), Memorial Day (the last Monday in May), Fourth of July, Labor Day (the first Monday in September), Thanksgiving Day, the day after Thanksgiving, December 24 and Christmas Day (December 25). When a holiday falls on Sunday, the following Monday shall be considered as a holiday.

INDEPENDENT-CONTRACTOR SUBHAULER means any carrier who renders service for a principal carrier, for a specified recompense, for a specified result, under the control of the principal as to the result of the work only and not as to the means by which such result is accomplished.

CITY DELIVERY or CITY DELIVERIES means the transportation of property to rotail stores or direct consumers of the property transported when the shipment originates within the City and County of San Prancisco at other than a carrier's depot, dock, where, pier or landing. COMMISSION means the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California. COURTER SERVICE is defined as operations having the following characteristics: (a) A carrier vehicle fleet consisting of only vehicles having a licensed weight of 4,500 pounds or less; (b) Delivery shall be made within 24 hours after pickup. DANGEROUS ARTICLES means articles described in the Hazardous Materials Tariff. ESCORT SERVICE means the furnishing of pilot cars or vehicles by a carrier as may be required by any governmental agency to accompany a shipment for highway safety. EXCEPTION RATINGS TARIFF means Exception Ratings Tariff 1 issued by the Commission. GOVERNING CLASSIFICATION means National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-E, 10 including supplements thereto or reissues thereof when the provisions of such supplements or reissues have been approved by the Commission. NAZARDOUS MATERIALS TARIFF means Hazardous Materials Tariff ATA 111-C, Cal PUC 13, of American Trucking Associations, Inc., Agent. HOLIDAYS means New Year's Day (January 1), Washington's Birthday (the third Monday in February), Memorial Day (the last Monday in May), Fourth of July, Labor Day (the first Monday in September), Thanksgiving Day, the Day after Thanksgiving, December 24 and Christmas Day (December 25). When a holiday falls on Sunday, the following Monday shall be considered as a holiday. INDEPENDENT-CONTRACTOR SUBHAULER means any carrier who renders service for a principal carrier, for a specified recompense, for a specified result, under the control of the principal as to the result of the work only and not as to the means by which such result is accomplished. PERMIT SHIPMENT means a shipment which because of its width, length, height, weight or size requires special authority from a governmental agency regulating the use of highways, roads or streets for the transportation of such shipment in whole or in part. POINT OF DESTINATION means the precise location at which property is tendered for physical delivery into the custody of the consignee. POINT OF ORIGIN means the precise location at which property is physically. delivered by the consignor into the custody of the carrier for transportation.
