<u>O P I N I O N</u>

Whippet Charter Service, Inc. (Whippet) operates service as a passenger stage corporation (PSC-910) between Hayward, Union City, Newark, Fremont, Milpitas, and Dublin, on the one hand, and United Airlines Maintenance Base at the San Francisco International Airport, on the other hand. The service is of the "hometo-work" character, providing commute transportation between these residential neighborhoods and the United Airlines Maintenance Base. By this application, Whippet requests authority to increase by \$1.50 per week the following passenger stage fares:

In support of this application, Whippet alleges that a rate increase is necessary to defray the unusual and extreme increase in operating costs. Whippet expects to operate at a loss during 1979 unless it is granted immediate relief. The increase in revenue with the proposed fares is estimated by the applicant to be \$30,816 annually.

The present fares were established by Decision 86587 dated November 2, 1976 in Application No. 56455.

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The Transportation Division staff has made an engineeringeconomic study of the applicant's operation and has prepared a report on the estimated results of operations based on the future year ending December 31, 1979 under present and proposed fares. This study is based on data included in the application and additional necessary data supplied by the applicant to the staff on January 12, 1979. The study report is hereby received as Exhibit 1. The exhibit indicates the following results:

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The applicant is presently operating at a loss. The fare increase authorized herein is an exception to the President's Guidelines for Wage and Price Increases. The proposed fares reflect an operating ratio of 92.9 percent and are reasonable in light of the guidelines and necessary to ensure the continued viability of this transportation service.

Copies of this application were served on interested parties and the application was listed in the Commission's Daily Calendar on July 20, 1978. Additionally, the Commission staff notified affected public transit operators and planning agencies of the filing of this application, pursuant to California Public Utilities Code Sections 730.3 and 730.5. No protests or comments have been received.

FINDINGS

After consideration, the Commission finds that:

1. The requested fare increase will result in additional annual revenue of \$30,816.

2. The proposed fare increase is justified.

3. A public hearing is not necessary.

The Commission concludes that the application shall be granted.

<u>O R D E R</u>

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Whippet Charter Service, Inc. is authorized to establish the increased fares as set forth in the application. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of this order may be made effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

2. This authority shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.

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3. In addition to the required posting and filing of tariffs, applicant shall give notice to the public by posting in its buses a printed explanation of its fares. Such notice shall be posted not less than five days before the effective date of the fare changes and shall remain posted for a period of not less than thirty days.

Since the carrier is currently operating at a loss, the effective date of this order is the date hereof.
