ORDER CORRECTING ERRORS

It has come to the Commission's attention that when the point Pala was added to the list of points to which rates are applicable from Group 6, Item 410, Minimum Rate Tariff 6-B, per Decision 90130, several rates, applicable to other points listed in the same item, were inadvertently reduced. The correct rates should be reestablished.

Pursuant to Resolution A-4661,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 6-B (Appendix A to Decision 82350, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective May 5, 1979, Ninth Revised Page 30, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications of common carriers shall be made effective not earlier than May 5, 1979, on one day's notice to the Commission and to the public.

3. In all other respects, Decision 82350, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

4. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of this decision on every common carrier, or such carriers' authorized tariff publishing agents, performing transportation services subject to Minimum Rate Tariff 6-B.

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5. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of the tariff amendment on each subscriber to Minimum Rate Tariff 6-B.
