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This is an application by Milton McDonogh (McDonogn), doing business as Angel Island Ferry, seeking an increase in fares.

A duly noticed public hearing was held in this matter before Administrative Law Judge Donald B. Jarvis in San Francisco on April 9, 1979, and it was submitted on that date.

McDonogh provides ferry service between Tiburon and Angel Island. The position of the parties at the outset of the hearing was as follows:

** The Department of Parks and Recreation levies a \$.25 fee which must be added to these fares.

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The Department of Parks and Recreation appeared as a protestant at the hearing. The city of Tiburon appeared as an interested party. The Commission staff also appeared in the proceeding. During the course of the hearing all the parties entered into a stipulation about the relevant facts. McDonogh agreed to provide certain data requested by the parties and modified his fare proposed as follows:

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Adult Fare	\$2.25
Children (5-11 years old)	1.00
Bicycles	- 50

In the light of the stipulation and modified fare request, the Department of Parks and Recreation withdrew its protest to the application.

Findings of Fact

1. McDonogh holds operating authority as a common carrier by vessel and operates ferry service between Tiburon and Angel Island, a distance of approximately three kilometers. The trip takes approximately 10 minutes each way. Service is provided by two vessels, "The Gaycin" with a capacity of 49 passengers and the "Angel Island" with a capacity of 400 passengers. During the winter months, regular service is provided on Saturdays and Sundays. Summer service is provided seven days per week.

2. The number of passengers carried by McDonogh and the revenue generated therefrom for the years 1974-1978 is as follows:

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3. McDonogh's present fares were authorized by Decision No. 60801 dated May 3, 1960. For the calendar year ending December 31, 1978, McDonogh had a net loss of \$21,879 and an operating ratio of 131 percent. For the test rate year ending June 30, 1980, McDonogh will, under present rates, suffer a net loss of \$27,385 and have an operating ratio of 138 percent.

4. The following estimate of earnings for the test year ending June 30, 1980 is reasonable:

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5. The fares proposed by McDonogh will result in yearly net income of \$8,537, an operating ratio of 92 percent and a rate of return of 7.1 percent.

6. McDonogh should be authorized to charge the following fares:

Adults					\$2.25
Children	(5–11	years	of	age)	1.00
Bicycles					- 50

7. McDonogh operated at a net loss in 1977 and 1978. The fares authorized herein which will yield net revenues of \$8,537 and a rate of return of 7.1 percent are within the wage and price standards promulgated by the Council on Wage and Price Stability.

8. McDonogh has agreed to furnish the Commission and the Department of Parks and Recreation a report showing the number of adults, children, and bicycles transported for the period from June 1, 1979 to December 31, 1979.

9. McDonogh has agreed not to file any additional fare increase applications during 1979.

10. The increases in fares and charges authorized by this decision are justified and are reasonable; and the present fares and charges, insofar as they differ from those prescribed by this decision, are for the future unjust and unreasonable.

Conclusions of Law

1. McDonogh should be authorized to increase his fares to those found herein to be just and reasonable.

2. McDonogh should be required to furnish the Commission and the Department of Parks and Recreation a report showing the numbers of adults, children, and bicycles transported for the period from June 1, 1979 to December 31. 1979.

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3. Because of the seasonal nature of McDonogh's operations this order should be effective on the date of its issuance.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Milton McDonogh, doing business as Angel Island Ferry, is authorized to establish the increased fares set forth in Appendix A attached hereto.

2. Tariff publications required to be made by McDonogh as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than the fifth day after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

3. The authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.

4. In addition to the required posting and filing of tariffs McDonogh shall give notice to the public by posting in his vessels and terminals a printed explanation of the new fares. Such notice shall be posted not less than five days before the effective date of the fare changes and shall remain posted for a period of not less than thirty days. 5. On or before January 15, 1980, McDonogh shall transmit to the Transportation Division of the Commission and the Department of Parks and Recreation a report, in writing, showing the numbers of adults. children, and bicycles transported from June 1, 1979 to December 31, 1979.
