## SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision 90117 dated March 27, 1979 in this proceeding, granted an extension of a certificate of public convenience and necessity as a highway common carrier of baggage and general commodities to Pak Moving, Inc., a California corporation. The decision contains language providing for a restriction of a portion of the certificate against the handling of certain shipments having a prior or subsequent movement by air. It has been brought to the attention of the Commission that the restriction was applied on a broader basis than was intended to a portion of the certificate which was the original unrestricted grant of authority to this carrier.

In the circumstances, it appears that the necessary correction should be made by the order herein and that Appendix A of Decision 90117 should be amended accordingly. The effective date of this order should be the day on which it is signed since there is no known opposition and no reason to delay correcting the discrepancy.

IT IS ORDERED that Decision 90117 is amended by substituting the attached First Revised Pages 5 and 6 of Appendix A in place and instead of Original Pages 5 and 6.

Service between Costa Mesa and Benicia shall be restricted against the transportation of shipments of hydrotheraphy baths, parts and accessories, motor assemblies, fibreglass shells and tubs, shower stalls, redwood tubs and heaters, except when tendered to or received from water, rail or motor carrier for further transportation.

\*Service in Paragraph B shall be restricted against the transportation of shipments having an immediately prior or subsequent movement by air, except between points and places in the San Francisco Territory, on the one hand, and, on the other hand, points and places on or within ten statute miles of points on the following routes:

(a) Interstate Highway 80 between Vallejo and Vacaville, inclusive; (b) California State Highway 12, between Fairfield and Rio Vista, inclusive.

San Francisco Territory includes all the City of San Jose and that area embraced by the following boundary: Beginning at the point the San Francisco-San Mateo County Line meets the Pacific Ocean; thence easterly along said County Line to a point one mile west of State Highway 82; southerly along an imaginary line one mile west of and paralleling State Highway 82 to its intersection with Southern Pacific Company right-of-way at Arastradero Road; southeasterly along the Southern Pacific Company right-of-way to Pollard Road, including industries served by the Southern

\*Pacific Company spur line extending approximately two miles southwest from Simla to Permanente; easterly along Pollard Road to W. Parr Avenue; easterly along W.
