ORDER OF PARTIAL SUSPENSION

Various common carriers engaged in intrastate transportation within California participate in National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-F, herein after referred to as the Governing Classification, for class ratings and other provisions. Also, various Commission minimum rate tariffs are subject to the class ratings and/or other provisions of such classification.

On May 22, 1979, the Commission in Special Tariff Docket 9373 granted authority to the National Motor Freight Classification to amend the NMF 100-F incorporating therein Supplement 1 to NMF 100-F. This supplement contains, among other changes, increases in truckload minimum weights for various articles classified in this supplement. Supplement 1 became effective for California intrastate traffic on May 26, 1979 and also became effective on the same day nationwide.

The Interstate Commerce Commission by order dated May 25, 1979 issued an Investigation and Suspension in Docket No. M-30073 suspending certain of the tariff schedules in Supplement 1 to and including December 25, 1979. During this period

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the I.C.C. will investigate all issues relating to the lawfulness of these suspended tariff schedules. $\frac{1}{2}$

California Manufacturers Association has requested that this Commission take official notice of the I.C.C.'s suspension of certain tariff schedules in Supplement 1 and likewise to suspend these schedules with regard to California intrastate traffic.

As a policy, this Commission has maintained the NMF 100-F as a Governing Classification for both interstate and intrastate traffic, under the Commission's minimum rate tariffs, in a parallel program with the I.C.C.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that there is good cause appearing to suspend the tariff schedules in Supplement 1 to NMF 100-F which are subject to the I.C.C. investigation until further order of the Commission.

Because the items in question have been suspended for interstate traffic and there is immediate need likewise to suspend the items for intrastate traffic and avoid hardship for California shippers, the order which follows will be made effective immediately.
