ORDER DENYING APPLICATION FOR REHEARING
AND REQUEST FOR STAY OF RESOLUTION NO. L-209

On May 24, 1979 the Indian Center of Santa Barbara, Inc. (Indian Center) filed with this Commission an Application for Rehearing and Request for Stay of Resolution No. L-209, passed by the Commission on May 8, 1979. The Indian Center filed the above application simultaneously with a Petition for Stay and Request for Modification of Condition 36 of Decision No. 89177 and several ancillary motions with supporting points and authorities. All of the above documents raise similar issues. In Decision No. 90510, signed today, this Commission has denied the Indian Center's Petition for Stay and Request for Modification of Decision No. 89177 and ancillary motions. After thorough consideration of the allegations made, we are also of the opinion that no good cause has been stated for granting the Indian Center's Application for Rehearing and Request for Stay of Resolution No. L-209. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that the Application of the Indian Center for Rehearing and Request for Stay of Resolution No. L-209 are hereby denied.
