SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision 90459 dated June 19, 1979, in this proceeding, granted authority to O.N.C. Freight Systems to sell and transfer a highway common carrier certificate to McLean Trucking Company, a North Carolina corporation, authorized to do business in California. The certificate authorizes the transportation of general commodities, with certain exceptions between points in Northern California. It has been brought to the attention of the Commission's staff that a portion of one of the exceptions was inadvertently omitted from Appendix A of Decision 90459.

In the circumstances, it appears that the necessary correction should be made by the order herein and that Appendix A of Decision 90459 should be amended accordingly. The effective date of this order should be the date on which it is signed since there is no known opposition and no reason to delay correcting the discrepancy.

IT IS ORDERED that Decision 90459 is amended by substituting the attached First Revised Page 3 in place and instead of Original Page 3.

IV. Through routes and rates may be established between any and all points and places specified in Paragraphs I and II above.

Except that pursuant to the authority herein granted carrier shall not transport any shipments of:

- *1. Used household goods, personal effects and office, store and institution furniture, fixtures and equipment not packed in salesmen's hand sample cases, suitcases, overmight or boston bags, briefcases, hat boxes, valises, traveling bags, trunks, lift vans, barrels, boxes, cartons, crates, cases, baskets, pails, kits, tubs, drums, bags (jute, cotton, burlap or gunny) or bundles (completely wrapped in jute, cotton, burlap, gunny, fibreboard, or straw matting).
 - 2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis, freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis.
 - 3. Livestock, viz.: barrows, boars, bulls, butcher hogs, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, feeder pigs, gilts, goats, heifers, hogs, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, rams (bucks), sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags, swine or wethers.
 - 4. Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semiplastic form and commodities in suspension in
 liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers,
 tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.
 - 5. Commodities requiring the use of special refrigeration or temperature control in specially designed and constructed refrigerator equipment.
 - 6. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump-type trucks or trailers or in hopper-type trucks or trailers.
 - Articles of extraordinary value.
