OPINION AND ORDER

Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (MRT 2) names rates and rules for the statewide transportation of general commodities by highway carriers. By this petition, California Trucking Association (CTA), seeks to amend MRT 2 Items 325 and 820 by adding additional commodities to the items and modifying the truckload commodity mixture as set forth currently in the items.

The Highway Carriers Association (ECA) filed a formal protest stating that the additional items are unrelated to the commodity groupings (chemicals and related items) in the items. Also, HCA protests the tariff containing two identical items for the same commodity grouping separated because the required minimum weights per truckload are different.

CTA in reply to the HCA protest states, "The revisions of Items 325 and 320 of MRT 2 propose only to enlarge the mixture application to embrace commodities now commonly moved in the same shipment tenders." In support of CTA's petition one of the shippers tendering traffic which is rateable under the items states:

"With the exception of anti-freeze, the vast majority of our customer orders are for less than truckload quantities and it is Union Carbide's objective to make Multi-Division freight consolidation shipments, wherever possible, to reduce transportation cost, transit time, and carrier operating expenses. In some instances the same customers receive products from more than one of the Carbide Divisions. Without consolidation, these orders would move as separate less than truckload shipments."

HCA's protest regarding the need for two commodity items in the tariff differing only in respect to the minimum weights per shipment overlooks the Commission's reasons for the establishment of the "Truckload Efficiency Service" rates. The heavier minimum weights per shipment were established to develop energy and cost savings through full utilization of carrier's equipment.

The Commission's ongoing policy is to encourage shippers and carriers to work together toward a healthy and viable transportation system. The "Truckload Efficiency Service" rates and related provisions were established on an experimental basis to allow a period of shipper and carrier use and exposure to the new concept, prior to evaluating the need for further revision.

CTA by this petition, and Union Carbide supporting as a shipper, seek to continue the new concept. Together through their experience under actual operating conditions, they find a need for the addition of items which are products or by-products of the commodities in Items 325 and 320.

The Commission concludes that in the furtherance of the Truckload Efficiency Service established by Decision 86833, dated January 5, 1977, the experience gained by the shippers and carriers in this instance under actual operating conditions should be given credence. A commodity group for rating purposes should provide in the mixture provisions for a shipment of the complete product line and its by-products.

The petition was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of June 4, 1979.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that petitioner's proposal is reasonable and the resulting minimum rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges for the transportation involved. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the petition should be granted as set forth in the ensuing order.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (Appendix D to Decision 31606, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective thirty-nine days after the date hereof, the revised pages set forth in Appendix A, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
- 2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject also to Decision 31606, as amended, are directed to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered by this decision.
- 3. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of this order shall be made effective not earlier than thirty-nine days after the date hereof and may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.
- 4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the amendments authorized by this order, are authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the amendments published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

- 5. In all other respects, Decision 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.
- 6. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of this decision on every common carrier, or such carrier's authorized tariff publishing agents, performing transportation services subject to Minimum Rate Tariff 2.
- 7. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of the tariff amendments on each subscriber to Minimum Rate Tariff 2.

The effective date of this order shall be thirty days after the date hereof.
