ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This complaint was set for hearing on May 22, 1979. During the course of the hearing the Administrative Law Judge ascertained that there was a nonjoinder of essential parties. He therefore terminated the hearing and gave The Gray Line, Inc., the complainant, 30 days to amend the complaint.

In early June complainant requested an extension to amend the complaint. The ALJ wrote to complainant on June 29, 1979 allowing ten days from the date of the letter for an amendment to the complaint to be filed.

There has been no such filing as of this date. We, therefore, conclude that this case should be dismissed for want of prosecution.

IT IS ORDERED that this complaint is dismissed without prejudice.

The effective date of this order shall be thirty days after the date hereof.
