FINAL OPINION AND ORDER

California Trucking Association (CTA) and California Dump Owners Association (CDTOA), petitioners, seek authority to increase the minimum rates for the transportation of property in dump truck equipment set forth in Minimum Rate Tariff 7-A (MRT 7-A). Petitioners assert that since the minimum rates in MRT 7-A were last adjusted pursuant to Decision No. 89597 dated October 31, 1978 in Case No. 5437 (Petition 301), carriers performing transportation services under that tariff have incurred increased operating costs. Petitioners ask that the rates be adjusted to reflect such costs using the same methods and procedures utilized by the staff in similar proceedings involving MRT 7-A.

Petitioners, in compliance with the President's guidelines on wage/price standards and the Commission's Resolution No. M-4704, dated January 30, 1979, allege that carriers' current revenues are not and will not be adequate to offset their expenses unless relief is granted as set forth in these petitions.

Interim Decision No. 90670 dated August 14, 1979, issued ex parte in this proceeding, authorized increases of ten percent (in surcharge form), in the rates and charges set forth in MRT 7-A.

The Commission staff has updated the datum plane and developed rates which are estimated to yield \$30.4 million in increased annual revenue.

The petitions and amendments were listed on the Commission's Daily Calendars of June 28, July 10, July 27 and September 5, 1979, respectively. No objection to the granting of the petitions, as amended, have been received. In the circumstances a public hearing is not necessary.

Findings

1. The present rates contained in MRT 7-A are predicated upon cost data developed by the Commission staff and introduced in Case 5437 (Petition 298), Decision 89597. Those cost data reflect labor and allied payroll expenses effective as of May 1, 1978. Since that time dump truck carriers operating under the minimum rates in MRT 7-A have incurred substantial increases in operating costs.

2. The rate increases resulting from the staff's recommended adjustments are justified. Its proposals should be adopted.

The Commission concludes that the petitions should be granted as set forth in the ensuing order.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 7-A (Appendix B to Decision 82061, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective November 1, 1979, Appendix A attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject also to Decision 82061, as amended, are directed to establish in their tariffs the increases necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered by this decision.

3. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than the effective date of the tariff pages attached hereto on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.


4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized by this order, are authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations, such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

5. In all other respects, Decision 82061, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

6. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of this decision on every common carrier, or such carriers authorized tariff publishing agents, performing transportation services subject to Minimum Rate Tariff 7-A.

7. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of the tariff amendments on each subscriber to Minimum Rate Tariff 7-A.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.

1000 ALTERNATIVE APPLICATION OF COMMON CARRIER RATES

Rates of common carriers by land published and filed with the Commission may be applied in lieu of the rates provided in this tariff, when such common carrier rates produce a lower aggregate charge for the same transportation, from the same point of origin to the same point of destination, than results from the application of the rates herein provided. (Subject to Notes 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5.)

NOTE 1.--(Applies only in Northern Territory.) When the point of origin is on an industrial railroad connecting with a common carrier railroad, the common carrier rate shall be deemed to apply from the point of origin.

NOTE 2.--When a rail carload rate is subject to varying minimum weights, dependent upon the size of the car ordered or used, the lowest minimum weight obtainable under such minimum weight provisions may be used in applying the basis provided in this item, when the rail carload rate is subject to a specified minimum weight, subject to the condition that if the car is loaded to full visible or weight carrying capacity, actual weight will apply, or, to actual weight but not less than a lesser carload minimum weight, the actual weight will apply, subject to the lesser carload minimum weight, if any. All rail carload rates are to be based upon standard carload weight requirements.

NOTE 3.--In applying the provisions of this item, a rate no lower than the common carrier rate and a weight no lower than the actual weight or published minimum weight (whichever is the higher) applicable in connection with the common carrier rate shall be used.

NOTE 4.--When rail switching charges are applicable in connection with line-haul movements by rail and the gross weight of the shipment exceeds the applicable carload minimum weight, only one rail switching charge shall be assessed.

NOTE 5.--In the event the common carrier rate which is used does not include loading and/or unloading services, a charge of 21 cents per ton for loading and/or a charge of 21 cents per ton for unloading shall be added to the applicable common carrier rate. No additional charge shall be applied for loading if the common carrier rate includes loading and no additional charge shall be applied for unloading if the common carrier rate includes unloading. Actuation by carrier's driver or employee of loading or unloading devices shall constitute loading or unloading service.
